- Chinese Cyberspace watchdogs: As per an article published on their official WeChat account, the Cybersecurity

 Administration of China (CAC) in the first half of the year 2022 has summoned more than 3400 platforms out of which 283 were fined. Other than that, 177 applications were removed from local app stores in violation of laws and regulations.

 Further, multiple accounts and websites found spreading pornographic content, illegal internet news services, and offering ghostwriting services to students were also closed.
- Green power campaign: The Qinghai province of China as part of a green power campaign spanning 35 days, has been able to generate 9.98 billion kWh of electricity. This stands equivalent to a reduction in 8.16 million tonnes of carbon dioxide or saving over 4.53 million tonnes of raw coal.

NEWS IN CHINA

President Xi Jinping attended the reception organized to celebrate the 95th founding anniversary of the People's
 Liberation Army (PLA) on 1 August. The venue of the reception
 was the Great Hall of the People by the Ministry of National
 Defense. The reception welcomed other senior leaders of the
 Communist Party of China. These included Li Zhanshu, Han
 Zheng, Wang Yang, Wang Huning Li Keqiang, Zhao Leji, and
 Wang Qishan. Defense Minister Wei Fenghe greeted all PLA
 officers and personnel on behalf of the CPC Central
 Committee, the State Council, and the Central Military
 Commission (CMC). Contributions of veterans and military
 heroes who contribute to the development of the PLA were



acknowledged and paid tribute by Wei. Wei regarded the dedication of people who put themselves at the front of defense industries, science, and technology. Wei also expressed gratitude towards the people's organizations and party committees at all levels who have supported the efforts of strengthening the armed forces and the national defense of the country. Wei also called for the implementation of President Xi Jinping's thoughts of strengthening national defense and speeding up the modernization process of the armed forces

- As per a report from Fitch Ratings, the passenger vehicle market of China showcased a sharp recovery in June due to the consumer stimulus packages. The recovery was subdued in the past year due to microchip shortages but this strong recovery is likely to continue till the third quarter of 2022. The previous month showed 42 percent in wholesale deliveries of passenger vehicles and retail sales rose by 22 percent from the previous year due to delayed orders from May and frontloaded demands from July. Due to the high demand for electric vehicles from overseas, exports of passenger vehicles continued to grow by 40 percent in the second quarter of 2022. Due to supply-chain bottlenecks and production halts, the months of April and May showed a slowdown, however, deliveries of electric vehicles doubled in the second quarter of the year. According to official data, the sales of new energy vehicles in June hit a record high of 596.000 units.
- Chinese entrepreneurs will be building a miniature hydropower plant and its

- necessary power lines in a small town in the Democratic Republic of Congo called Kenge (around 269 km from the capital city of Kinshasa). The small contracts are part of China's slow shift from large infrastructure projects to smaller and profitable ventures under the banner of the Belt and Road Initiative. Such ventures tend to be less risky for investors especially private entrepreneurs who have limited resources at their disposal. President Xi Jinping in the third Belt and Road symposium said that "small and beautiful" projects of high quality are sustainable and improve the livelihoods of people and such projects should be a priority in overseas cooperation. According to Christian-Geraud Neema, a Congolese mining and policy analyst, Beijing has mentioned that it seeks for more private corporations to engage in Africa.
- A yellow alert for high temperature was renewed by the Chinese national observatory as intense heatwaves were observed in many regions of the country. As per the National Meteorological Center, Shaanxi, Hubei, Sichuan, Chongging, parts of Xinjiang, regions south of the Yangtze River, and the southern region of China are expected to have a temperature over 35 degrees Celsius during daylight hours and the temperature in Sichuan and Chongqing may surpass 40 degrees Celsius. The public has been advised by the Center to avoid any outdoor activities in the afternoon and workers who are exposed to high temperatures or work outside to ensure protective measures.
- A mock air combat training was organized by the PLA Eastern Theatre Command's

<u>naval aviation force</u> to promote pilot abilities to enter combat status under abnormal situations at any time. The drills are initiated amidst US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's possible Taiwan visit. CCTV news released a video clip that shows multiple Su-30 fighter jets flying at low altitude entering the training airspace and getting through a simulated hostile antiaircraft firepower. The jets entered top combat-ready status from training status upon receiving a sudden command to check an unknown air situation. Tang Feilong, a pilot of PLA's naval aviation brigade of the Eastern Theatre Command said that the onboard equipment and technical measures were used for locating the target and flying to the location to drive the target away. Further Tang added that the fighters then patrolled the airspace assigned to them, waited for possible battles, and then returned to base after the replacement forces arrived. Hang Chengche, squadron leader of the brigade stated that the air combat training drills during night-time aim to improve the fulltime combat capabilities of the pilots for any future battles.
